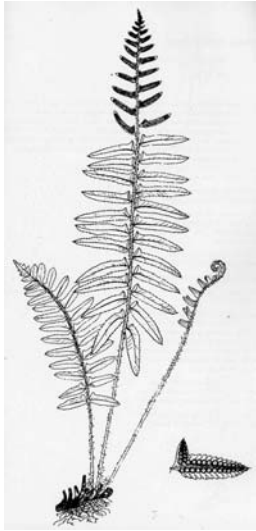
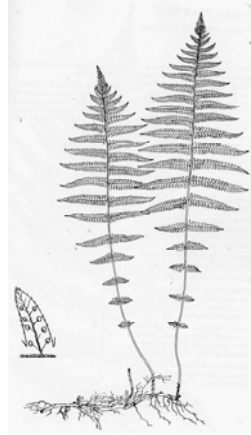


Fern Drawings: Repeats from the First Workshop



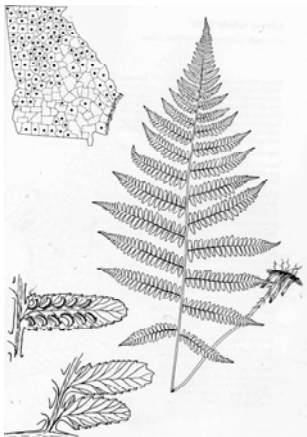
Christmas fern (*Polystichum acrostichoides*): pinnae look like Christmas stockings or sleighs



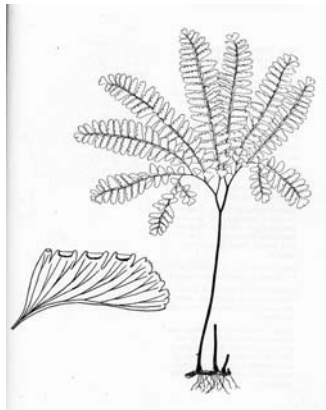
New York fern (*Thelypteris novaboracensis*): “Burning candle at both ends.”



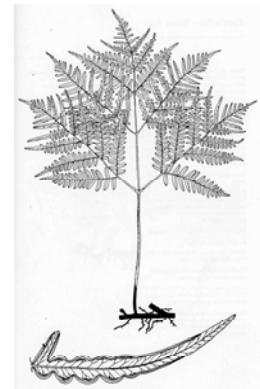
Broad beech fern (*Thelypteris hexagonoptera*). Triangle shape. Lowest 2 pinna at 45° angle



Southern lady fern (*Athyrium felix-femina*): Pinnae are serrated, giving a rather frilly look. Rachis often reddish. Lower rachis has scales.



Northern maidenhair fern (*Adiantum pedatum*): Fronds create a C shape; pinnules look like feet with toes.



Bracken fern (*Pteridium aquilinum*): Often bent parallel to ground. Pinnules on upper ¼ of pinna differ from lower ones. Ternately divided



Rattlesnake fern (*Botrychium virginianum*): very small and frilly.
